



Fees Structure 2009

This publication details the fees payable for degrees at the Graduate School of Public and Development Management. The fees are calculated on the assumption that a participant on a course will not repeat a course, and will take all courses within the School. If a student repeats a course, chooses to do elective courses outside of the School, deregisters from the degree for a period of time, and then resumes studying, it will have an affect on the cost of doing the degree for which they are registered.

Dates of payment

With certain exceptions, including occasional students, and international students (see below) tuition fees are due by 31 March. Additional fees (notes and computer lab fees) are payable as and when levied.

All students are required to pay R6 000 on registration.

All students who are in University residence are required to pay 20% of the residence fee in advance unless they are able to provide evidence of a bursary or scholarship which covers residence fees and which is acceptable to the University fees office.

Fees for international students

For full details and exceptions on fees for international students, consult the fees booklet of the University.

An international student is defined as a student who is neither a South African national nor a permanent resident of South Africa at the time of registration. International students cannot register at the university unless their fees are paid in full; including tuition fees, medical cover and on-campus accommodation. Additionally, international postgraduate students from outside the SADC must pay a non-refundable, annual International Postgraduate Registration fee of R14 000.

Students from the SADC member countries and Rwanda pay local fees as opposed to other international students. The SADC member countries are Angola, Botswana, Democratic Republic of Congo, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Seychelles, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia and Zimbabwe.
